SESSION THREE: Study Outline for Romans 3:21-4:25

Introduction: Justification by Faith

Purpose: Explore the doctrine of justification by faith and its implications for believers. **Themes:** Righteousness apart from the Law, the role of faith, Abraham as the model of faith, the fulfillment of God's promises.

Objective: Understand how Paul articulates the central theme of justification by faith, using Abraham as an example of faith that is credited as righteousness.

I. The Righteousness of God through Faith (Romans 3:21-26)

- Romans 3:21-22:
 - God's righteousness is revealed apart from the Law.
 - This righteousness is accessible to all through faith in Jesus Christ.
- Romans 3:23-24:
 - All have sinned and fall short of God's glory, but are justified freely by His grace.
 - Justification is a gift through the redemption that came by Christ.
- Romans 3:25-26:
 - God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement, received by faith.
 - Demonstrates God's justice and His ability to justify those who have faith in Jesus.

II. The Exclusion of Boasting (Romans 3:27-31)

- Romans 3:27-28:
 - Boasting is excluded because justification is by faith, not by works of the Law.
- Romans 3:29-30:
 - God is the God of both Jews and Gentiles, justifying all through faith.

- Romans 3:31:
 - The Law is upheld through faith, not nullified.

III. Abraham Justified by Faith (Romans 4:1-12)

- Romans 4:1-3:
 - Abraham's righteousness was credited to him through faith, not works.
- Romans 4:4-5:
 - Justification comes to those who trust in God, who justifies the ungodly.
- Romans 4:6-8:
 - David speaks of the blessedness of the one to whom God credits righteousness apart from works.
- Romans 4:9-12:
 - Abraham was justified by faith before circumcision, making him the father of all who believe, both circumcised and uncircumcised.

IV. The Promise Realized through Faith (Romans 4:13-25)

- Romans 4:13-15:
 - The promise to Abraham was not through the Law but through the righteousness that comes by faith.
- Romans 4:16-17:
 - The promise comes by faith so that it may be by grace and guaranteed to all Abraham's offspring.
- Romans 4:18-22:
 - Abraham's unwavering faith in God's promises, despite natural impossibilities.
 - His faith was credited to him as righteousness.
- Romans 4:23-25:
 - The words "it was credited to him" were not for Abraham alone but also for us who believe in God, who raised Jesus from the dead.
